Monthly Executive Report as of February, 2019

I. Market Value as of February, 2019

The market value of the Economic and Social Stabilization Fund (ESSF) totaled US\$14,212.36 million at the end of the month. The variation of the period was due to: (i) accrued interest of US\$13.59 million, (ii) capital losses on investments of US\$97.17 million and (iii) administrative, custody and others costs of US\$0.06 million.

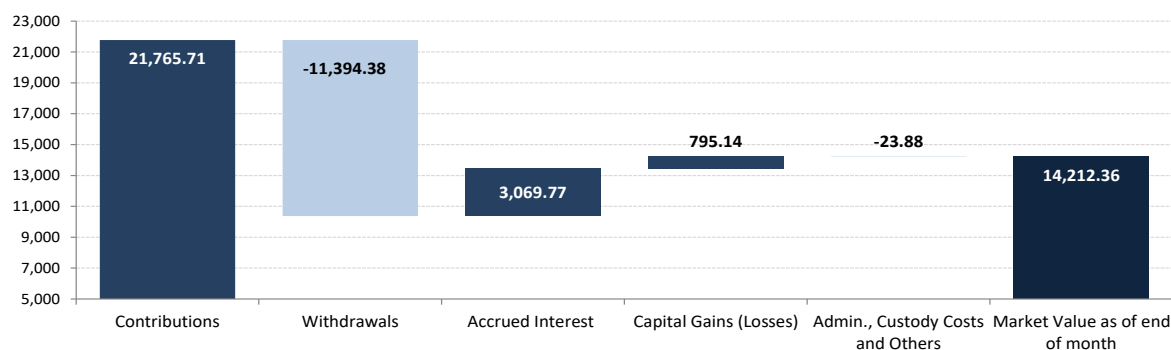

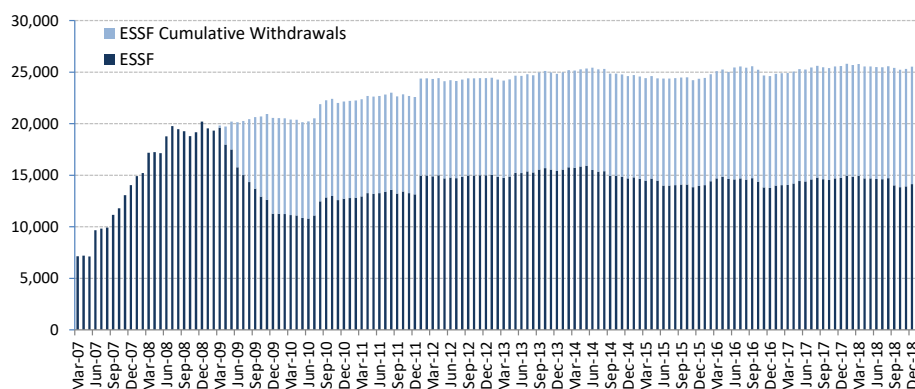

II. Return as of February, 2019

The return in US dollars was -0.59% in the month. This was due to the performance of Money Market and Sovereign Bonds, -0.85%, Sovereign Inflation Linked Bonds, -0.24%, and Equities, 2.62%. Money Market and Sovereign Bonds portfolio's return and Sovereign Inflation Linked Bonds portfolio's return were explained by the depreciation of the currencies versus the US dollar. Equities had a positive return in dollars explained by the performance in local currency. The fund's monthly return in pesos was -3.10%. Year to Date return in dollars was 0.56% and -6.06% in pesos. Finally, annualized return since inception was 2.42% in US dollars and 4.03% in pesos.

Due to the change in the fund's investment policy occurred in 2013, the return of the following classifications, "Money market and sovereign bonds" and "Sovereign bonds indexed to inflation" are calculated starting in the beginning of August 2013 and for "Equities" starting in the middle of August of 2013.

^(d) CLP return corresponds to the sum of the percentage change of the CLP/USD exchange rate and the USD return.

Returns for periods of more than one year are compound annualized rates while those for less than a year correspond to the change as seen in the stated period. With a view to meeting high standards of transparency and providing a better assessment of the gains or losses on investments, the Ministry of Finance discloses the fund's return in different time horizons and currencies. With respect to the horizon, it is important to note that, in keeping with the medium- and long-term investment policy, the return assessment should focus on that period, disregarding fluctuations that may occur monthly or quarterly. With regard to returns expressed in different currencies, the return in US dollars allows for an assessment which is more in line with the investment policy given that the fund's resources are wholly invested abroad and in foreign currency. The return in Chilean pesos is also disclosed. This return reflects changes in the peso-dollar exchange rate and, therefore, may experience greater fluctuations. Finally, as with any investment, returns obtained in the past do not guarantee future positive results.
