ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL STABILIZATION FUND

AUGUST 2007

I. The Economic and Social Stabilization Fund

The Economic and Social Stabilization Fund (ESSF) was established on March 6, 2007, in conformity with the *Decreto con Fuerza de Ley* N° 1 of 2006. The first contribution to the fund was received on that date and deposited in a special Treasury Services account for a total amount of US\$ 2,580 million. US\$ 2,563 million of this contribution was derived from the Copper Compensation Fund, which was merged with the ESSF under Law 20,128.

It is important to point out that the final contribution amount for 2007 depends on: (a) the actual surplus of the year prior; (b) the contribution to the Pension Reserve Fund (PRF); and (c) the utilization of the authority provided under article 11 of Law N° 20,128 pertaining to capitalization of the Central Bank of Chile.

The following table contains a summary of the net contributions:

The ESSF's resources have been managed by the Central Bank of Chile, acting as fiscal agent, since March 6, 2007, according to Ministry of Finance's Supreme Decree N° 1,383 of 2006.

The following shows the ESSF's market value¹ in United States dollars as of August 31, 2007. The fund's investments are governed by DFL N°1 of 2006 of the Ministry of Finance and supplementary regulations.

Chart 1: Composition by Asset Class

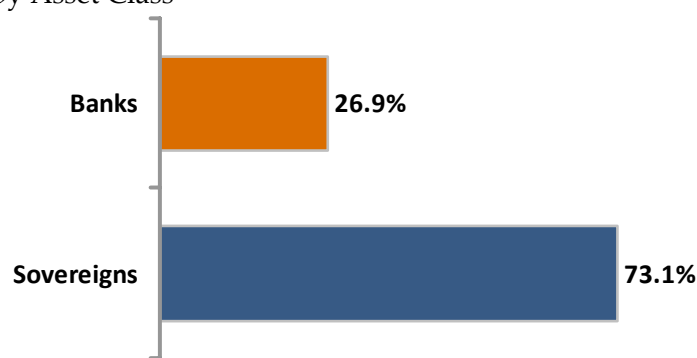


Chart 2: Composition by Asset Classes and Currency
